


How to join

Where are the meetings held?



The benefits

Throughout the year, the ENHG holds various meetings at which experts from a wide range of fields speak. The group also offers a programme of interesting activities including several field trips. On top of this it brings out a monthly newsletter called *Focus*, and members and sponsors annually receive *Tribulus*: a peer-reviewed scientific journal.

Lectures

The group runs bi-monthly lectures, (open to all) by experts from a wide range of fields all related in some way to natural history: e.g. astronomy, botany, zoology, geology, paleontology, archaeology, local culture & history, environmental conservation and sustainable energy sources.

• Field Trips

The ENHG offers a regular programme of day and overnight field trips, usually led by experts, to areas of interest throughout the UAE. Past excursions include a mountain climb, mangrove tour, family weekend, spring annuals, bird watching, etc. Field trips are limited to members only.

Focus

The group sends out a monthly newsletter called *Focus* to all of its members and sponsors, containing information about the happenings of the group over the previous month, upcoming talks, field trips and points of note relating to natural history developments in the region. All members are welcome to contribute to the newsletter.

TRIBULUS

All members and sponsors of ENHG receive *Tribulus*, which is published annually by the group and is the only peer-reviewed scientific journal of its kind in the UAE.
